TINY WARRIORS: BABY JAXX'S NEONATAL JOURNEY

The Neonatal Unit at Northern Hospital Epping is a haven for tiny warriors, where every breath is a victory and every heartbeat a testament to resilience. For baby Jaxx, born prematurely at 30 weeks, this was where he spent 52 days to ensure he was growing healthily. Without round-the-clock care, babies like Jaxx may not have a fighting chance.

In January 2023, Jaxx's mother, Brianna, was rushed into the hospital via ambulance, where Jaxx was born just six minutes after its arrival, weighing only 1800 grams.

"On the Saturday he was born, I was in quite a bit of pain. I took some Panadol and headed off to work but realised something wasn't right. He was delivered in just six minutes once I arrived to the hospital via ambulance." Brianna said.

This is where Jaxx began his long journey in the Neonatal Unit.

"He was on oxygen and had a feeding tube the whole time. You can imagine how scary this is for some parents."

At the time, this was an incredibly stressful and traumatising occurrence of events for Brianna and her family, with Brianna saying, "there were times I felt like I couldn't walk back inside the hospital. I don't know how I did it, but you just need to push through."

While Brianna mentioned the care at the NICU was incredible, the lingering fear that something bad could happen at any minute was all too real. The upset with being around hospitals after already spending so much time there, and not knowing the outcome, can put anyone at unease.



Due to her experience with Jaxx, Brianna has decided to initiate a fundraising effort to help Northern Hospital Epping fundraise for cot cams – these are small cameras inside the isolettes, so parents who are needing to leave their baby in hospital overnight, or for an extended period of time, can still keep an eye on them at home. This allows for parents to get some rest while knowing their child is being taken care of and can see them at any time they wish to through an app on their phone. This will make the lives of the families easier, and their minds put at ease, knowing their little one is receiving the utmost of care.

"I remember seeing that Monash Children's Hospital had them," said Brianna, "and thought to myself, wow, I wish I had that. You're putting complete trust in the healthcare workers and just hoping for the best."

Baby Jaxx and Brianna are both doing well, with Jaxx much heathier and stronger, now a year on.

"Everyone was amazing. The nurses in the NICU are so beautiful, we couldn't have asked for anything more."

With contributions from its dedicated patrons, Northern Health Foundation was delighted to re-open the outdoor courtyard of its Palliative Care Unit at Northern Hospital Epping on Thursday, 7 December 2023.

With the sun shining overhead, patrons and their special guests joined with members of Northern Health Foundation Board, management team, staff and patients for a special afternoon tea to officially re-open the gardens after having received an extensive make-over.

Northern Health engineering and maintenance teams worked tirelessly over the past months to complete the project in time for the launch. The project included some structural works, the installation of undercover family entertainment areas, complete with outdoor sofas and dining table.

The entertainment area, which was contributed by patron Josie Minniti OAM and her fundraising network, provides a comfortable space for patients to gather with their loved ones, share meals together, or commemorate special occasions. Josie has been a long-time supporter of Northern Health's Cancer Services.

In a special corner of the gardens, affectionally named 'Kilmore Corner' in recognition of the contribution of patron Bev Carman and her fundraising efforts which center around the Kilmore community, stands a beautiful water feature surrounded by lush plants and decorative wall features. This space provides a tranquil, respite area for patients and family members wanting some quiet, reflective time. The rest of the gardens were funded

through a financial grant from Dry July Foundation, after staff gathered to fundraise for the cause in 2022.
